Kurious Kumara got up one day, looked out past the paddocks and far, far away. Far in the distance, way over there, he could hear the cow's mooing and smell the farm air.






So, he ran to the kitchen, looking for Mum, calling for Dad. "We're off to Grandpa's farm today; there's fun to be had".

So, the tractor started up, and with a jolt, they were away. Rolling across the paddocks to feed the cows their hay.




The ground was very muddy, as there had recently been heavy rain.
The water had built up, As there was nowhere for it to drain.


The farm's irrigation channels were filled to the brim.
"Let's play in the water, grandpa", Kurious Kumara said with a grin.














"Not here", said grandpa. "This is not a safe swimming spot."

"Hop down, son," said Grandpa sternly, "You might fall in. The water is very deep in there, and the light is very dim."







"We need to go check on the dam, the one that supplies the farm.


Hop back on the tractor Kurious Kumara, and we will drive past the big red barn."


"What are those, grandpa? Those deep holes in the ground. Are they for the fence posts? Is that why they are round?"

So, he slipped out the back door and ran to the water's edge. He took off his clothes, and he perched on the ledge.






He kicked off his shoes and pulled his sunhat from his head. "Stop and remember", chirped Piwi ", What Mum and Dad said."

"I remember now," said Kurious Kumara. "It doesn't matter where I am."


"I can only go swimming when an adult says I can."


Mum said, "We love you, Kurious Kumara, you curious little guy." Dad said, "Now let's swim safely while the adults watch by."
